

## ON THE COVER:

Roughly two hours south of Raleigh by way of the Interstate Highway System, Wilmington is an old town dating back to colonial times, which has a rich history that is very much worth exploring. Now it has also become something of a foodie town, so no one needs to worry about going hungry. Or thirsty!

After a bracing drive to the historic district, we quickly booked ourselves into a parking deck along the banks of the Cape Fear River and hit the bricks for a walk along the river to meet up at a relatively new German restaurant called Prost Biergarten. The staff was terrific, making quick work of orders for Wiener Schnitzel, Bratwurst, Spaetzle, und Bier. It was all fantastic, with clear memories of the Black Forest dancing in our heads ... and leaving our crew ready for a more detailed walk-about town.



One of the themes that the BMW CCA has recently been exploring is focused on the notion of “heroes”. There are many people who can be considered heroes, but a place like Wilmington puts the concept on display in some fascinating and thoughtful ways.

Hero also is a concept that requires some context setting. During the American Revolution, as the Colonies sought to shake themselves loose of the

English Crown, the area was part of an ongoing conflict. During the American Civil War, the port was important to the Confederacy and was blockaded by the US Navy. Blockade Runners were considered heroic to the locals but treasonous to the United States.

Wilmington was very much a part of the Slave Experience for African Americans, something which is well depicted at the Bellamy Mansion and Slave Quarters. The fight against the historic injustice of this institution was clearly heroic. Visiting this is a very thoughtful experience.



Just before we got to town, a fire broke out in one of the large, beautiful, old homes in the historic district. The local firefighters put up a valiant effort to contain the flames. Sadly, the building was lost, but the neighboring ones were saved. Heroes can come in all shapes and sizes.

But perhaps one of the great opportunities to visit with American heroes in Wilmington is found at the

USS North Carolina. The World War II battleship was the first of the Navy's "fast" battleships and was a stunning, new, design when her keel was laid down in 1937. A beautiful ship, even now, it is not hard to see why her nickname was "Showboat". Following the war, it was decommissioned in 1947 and placed in reserve. By the late 1950s, she faced the threat of being scrapped, but a grassroots campaign in North Carolina saved her. Through donations from schoolchildren, veterans, and citizens, she was relocated to Wilmington in 1961 and opened as a museum ship the following year.



During the war, North Carolina earned 15 battle stars, more than any other battleship in our fleet. The list of battles waged is both long and thought provoking.

The stories of her crew, the places they went, and the things they accomplished are sobering. And it is a wonderful reflection on the remarkable things that collective action can lead to. The crew of this great ship were clearly heroes who are worthy of retaining in our collective memories. And they are! The ship is one of the great tourist attractions in the State, recording roughly 250,000 visitors per year.



Our exploration of Wilmington included a long walk through the Historic District before the sun began to fade for the afternoon. Some of our number stayed on in a lovely B&B close to downtown. Others needed to spool up the Bimmers and head for home. Either way, it was a brilliant day that offered good food, terrific friends, great perspectives on American history, and a chance to plan for more future adventures. There are many great roads to explore, and life is clearly better in a Bimmer. Let's roll.

Fellow Tarheel Members, it is election time again. We hold elections for half of our elected board every year and now is the time. Nominations are open at this time for the following positions:

1. Vice President  
Treasurer  
Communications Director
2. Please review the job descriptions listed below to determine if you are interested in helping our chapter continue to be the great organization that it has become.
  - (a) The Vice President shall perform the duties of the President in the absence of, or by reason of the disability of the President, and shall furthermore perform such other duties as the President or Board may assign.
  - (b) The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all Club funds, as authorized by the Board; shall keep accurate and detailed records of all such receipts and disbursements; and shall deposit all funds received on behalf of the Club in a depository designated by the Board. The Treasurer shall make a report at the Annual Meeting, and shall also make such additional reports as may be requested by the Board. Except as provided herein, no person shall incur an obligation to, nor commit the credit of, the Club, unless specifically authorized by the Treasurer, acting in concert with the Board.
  - (c) The Communications Director shall be responsible for the publication and timely distribution of the Club communications, in formats approved by the Board, including but not restricted to printed and electronic versions; and for the planning, supervision and coordination of all activities necessary thereto, including the appointment of Club members to assist in carrying out said activities. Whereas the purpose of the official communication is to unite and inform the membership of the Club, its content shall therefore reflect the Purpose of the Club. The Communications Director shall make periodic reports to the Board on the status of the communication media, including but not restricted to costs incurred in the production and distribution of the media. The Board shall function as the editorial board for the official communication in all matters pertaining to such statements of Club policy as may be published in the media. The Communications Director shall be principally responsible for the solicitation and maintenance of all advertising in the communication but may delegate such responsibility to an Active Member of the Club, subject to approval by the Board.
3. Nominees must be Tarheel BMW CCA members and must confirm their acceptance of the nomination. Nominations must also come from Tarheel members.
4. Along with acceptance, each candidate should provide a statement as to why they should be elected to the nominated position.



## BMW Performance Center Classics and Motorsport Festival

The BMW Performance Center hosted an all-day Classics and Motorsports Festival on Sunday October 26. Several Tar Heel members made the trip down from North Carolina for the day. You could attend just the afternoon event or add on a morning driving session with the Performance Center cars.



I chose the 10am session and got to drive the M340i in the Rat Race competition, the M240i on an autocross course, and an M4 on lead follow laps behind an instructor around the track. There were also hot lap rides, and the X5 off road course. Soon it was time for a nice buffet lunch.



Out back, so many incredible cars were on display. The list included a 328 racecar, a 507 coupe, an M1, several 3.0 coupes including a rare Alpina 3.0, and many classic and current race cars including the GTD Pro class winning Paul Miller M3 GT3 that had just won in the Petit Le Mans. But the star of the show

was the BMW NA owned McLaren F1, that raced Le Mans in 1996, finishing 4th! They had the engine cover opened, so we could marvel at the 650 HP naturally aspirated BMW V12 powering the beast!



As the afternoon progressed, the cars were sent out on the Performance Center track in small groups of 5 or so cars. Soon it was time for Charity Laps to benefit the BMW CCA Foundation and Street Survival. Twenty or more folks signed up. It was then fired up and ran several laps around the track. Everyone lined the fences to hear that V12 sing! All too soon, the day was over. Everyone left with big smiles, having enjoyed the day.


